STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT Pertaining to Witness Fees Paid by the District Courts.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

4 MRSA § 173, sub-§ 4, as last amended by PL 1979, c. 127, § 16, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:

Notwithstanding any other provision of this subsection, when any police officer is compensated by a municipality for attendance at court, the Treasurer of State shall reimburse the municipality for the actual costs incurred as evidenced by an itemized claim submitted to the treasurer by the municipality.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide complete reimbursement to municipalities of actual costs of service including salary, fringe benefits, cost-related travel and related payroll cost rendered by any municipality police officer to the District Court.
