COMMITTEE OF CONFERENCE AMENDMENT "/" to H.P. 1158, L.D. 1379, Bill, "AN ACT to Establish a Consolidated Map of the State."

Amend the Bill by inserting $\langle ---- \rangle$ before the enacting clause the following:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the State of Maine provides maps of the State for the convenience of citizens and the general public; and

Whereas, this legislation is vitally needed to provide necessary funds to supply these maps at the earliest possible time; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,'

Amend the Bill by inserting at the end before the Statement of Fact the following:

'Sec. 6 Allocation. The following funds are allocated from the Highway Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

\$100,000

Allocated from the Highway Fund to produce a consolidated map of the State. One million copies shall be published and made available for sale to the public at 25¢ each, 5¢ of which may be kept by the vendor.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Statement of Fact

This amendment allocates funds from the Department of Transportation to publish 1,000,000 copies of a map. The map shall consist of a highway map on one side and an economic development map on the other side and shall be sold to the public.
