STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Establish a Consolidated Map of the State.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA § 7003, sub-§ 4 is enacted to read:

4. State map. The State Development Office shall cooperate with the Department of Transportation by providing sufficient information available to it for the creation of the consolidated state outdoor recreational map under Title 23, section 4206, subsection 1, paragraph L.

Sec. 2. 12 MRSA § 602, sub-§ 17 is enacted to read:

17. State map. To cooperate with the Department of Transportation by providing sufficient information concerning parks and recreational areas and facilities for the creation of the consolidated state outdoor recreational map under Title 23, section 4206, subsection 1, paragraph L.

Sec. 3. 12 MRSA § 6022, sub-§ 13 is enacted to read:

13. State map. The commissioner shall cooperate with the Department of Transportation by providing sufficient information concerning marine resources for the creation of the consolidated state outdoor recreational map under Title 23, section 4206, subsection 1, paragraph L.

Sec. 4. 12 MRSA § 7034, sub-§ 8, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 679, § 1, is amended by adding at the end a new sentence to read:

He shall also provide sufficient information concerning fisheries and wildlife resources to the Department of Transportation for the creation of the consolidated state outdoor recreational map under Title 23, section 4206, subsection 1, paragraph L.

Sec. 5. 23 MRSA § 4206, sub-§ 1, ¶ L is enacted to read:

L. To coordinate efforts for the publication of a consolidated state outdoor recreational map. All state departments shall cooperate with the Department of Transportation for the purpose of this paragraph. The map shall include highway information, outdoor recreational information and such other information as will best promote the safety, convenience and welfare of the people using it and the economic development of the State.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill creates a coordinated system for publication of a consolidated state outdoor recreation map. The Department of Transportation would coordinate the effort, securing information from the various departments, and would publish the map.

To effect maximum economy and reduce unit costs, 100,000 copies of the consolidated state outdoor recreation map will be produced as a split-run of the official state highway map. In 1979, 1.7 million copies of the highway map were printed at unit cost of about 8.5 cents.
