STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Make Allocations from the Regulatory Fund, Public Utilities Commission, for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1982 and June 30, 1983.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period will not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal vear; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of the department will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1981; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Allocation of Regulatory Fund; Public Utilities Commission. Income to the Regulatory Fund, Public Utilities Commission for the next 2 fiscal years, from July 1, 1981 to June 30, 1982 and from July 1, 1982 to June 30, 1983, shall be

segregated, apportioned and disbursed as designated in the following schedule:

This allocates the Regulatory Fund, Public Utilities Commission, which is required by the Public Laws of 1979, chapter 427.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect July 1, 1981.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Public Law 1979, chapter 427, established an assessment on utilities based on not more than .2% on the intrastate gross operating revenues. It also requires legislative approval of such assessments and related expenditures in the same manner as the budget of the Public Utilities Commission is approved. This bill provides the necessary approval.
