SENATE AMENDMENT " C " to SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to
S.P. 649, L.D. 1677, Bill, "AN ACT to Make Corrections of
Errors and Inconsistencies in the Laws of Maine."

Amend the Amendment by inserting at the end before the
Statement of Fact the following:

'Further amend the Bill by inserting at the end before
the emergency clause the following:

Sec. 1. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §8-A, ^{first ¶,} /as enacted by PL 1971,
c. 544, §142, is amended to read:

← The trustees of the University of Maine may appoint persons
to act as policemen who shall, within the limits of the property
owned by or under the control of the university, possess all of
the powers of policemen in criminal cases and civil violations.'

Further amend Part B by renumbering the sections to read
consecutively.

Statement of Fact

The Maine Criminal Code, Title 17-A, created a distinction
between criminal offenses and "civil violations." This
distinction, as enacted, created ambiguity regarding the
jurisdiction of University of Maine police in "civil violations."
This amendment removes that ambiguity.
