18 **AN ACT to Establish Municipal Cost Components**
19 **for Services to be Rendered in Fiscal Year 1982-83.**

21 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legislature
22 do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment
23 unless enacted as emergencies; and

24 Whereas, prompt determination and certification of the
25 municipal cost components in the Unorganized Territory Tax
26 District is necessary to the establishment of a mill rate
27 and the levy of the unorganized territory educational and
28 services tax; and

29 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these
30 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Consti-

1 tution of Maine and require the following legislation as
2 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public
3 peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

4 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

5 **Municipal cost components for services rendered.** In
6 accordance with the Revised Statutes, Title 36, chapter 115,
7 the Legislature determines that the net municipal cost com-
8 ponent for services and reimbursements to be rendered in
9 fiscal year 1982-83 is \$7,714,166 as reflected by the fol-
10 lowing tabulation:
