15 **AN ACT to Clarify the Boundary Between the Town**
16 **of Waterford and the Township of Albany.**
17

18 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

19 **Waterford-Albany town line established.** The town line
20 between the Town of Waterford, Oxford County, and the Town-
21 ship of Albany, Oxford County, is established as follows:

22 Beginning at a stone post set in a pile of stones
23 and inscribed "S/A" and a wooden post inscribed "CSM
24 1949 S/W" which mark the southeasterly corner of the
25 Town of Stoneham and the southwesterly corner of the
26 Township of Albany and which are located approximately
27 three hundred and fifty (350) feet South 68° West from
28 the summit of Baldpate Hill, so-called;

1 Thence North 72° 14' East along a spotted and
2 painted line for a distance of sixteen hundred and
3 twenty-eight (1,628) feet more or less to a cut granite
4 post standing in a pile of stone on the westerly side
5 of a woods road;

6 Thence North 18° West along a spotted and painted
7 line for a distance of seventeen hundred and ninety
8 (1,790) feet more or less to a cut granite post
9 inscribed "A/W";

10 Thence North 72° 14' East along a spotted and
11 painted line crossing Crooked River, so-called, for a
12 distance of twenty-five hundred and ninety (2,590) feet
13 more or less to a cut granite post inscribed "W/A,
14 1895" which stands on the westerly side of state high-
15 way Route #35;

16 Thence North 71° 30' East crossing Route #35 to
17 and along a spotted and painted line for a distance of
18 twenty-seven hundred and seventy-five (2,775) feet more
19 or less to a cut granite post and wooden post inscribed
20 "CSM 1949 W/A";

21 Thence same course along a spotted and painted
22 line to and along a stone wall for a distance of six
23 hundred and sixty-five (665) feet more or less to a
24 wooden post inscribed "CSM 1949 W/A angle" which stands
25 in the intersection of two stone walls;

26 Thence North 54° 33' East along a stone wall and
27 spotted and painted line and across an open field for a
28 distance of eight hundred and forty (840) feet more or
29 less to a cut granite post inscribed "W/A" which stands
30 on the easterly side of the Sawin Hill Road, so-called;

31 Thence North 73° 46' East across an open field to
32 and along a spotted and painted line for a distance of
33 twenty-two hundred and nine (2,209) feet more or less
34 to a cedar post standing in a pile of stones and
35 inscribed "W/A 1981";

36 Thence North 71° 30' East along a spotted and
37 painted line to and along a stone wall for a distance
38 of seventeen hundred and six (1,706) feet more or less
39 to a wooden post inscribed "W/A 1949 CSM" which stands
40 at the easterly end of the last mentioned stone wall;

1 Thence same course along a spotted and painted
2 line for a distance of eleven hundred and forty-four
3 (1,144) feet more or less to a cut granite post
4 inscribed "W/A" which stands on the summit of Abbott
5 Hill, so-called;

6 Thence South $18^{\circ} 28'$ East along a spotted and
7 painted line for a distance of seventeen hundred and
8 seventy-one (1,771) feet more or less to a wooden post
9 standing in a pile of stones and inscribed "CSM 1949
10 W/A";

11 Thence North $71^{\circ} 30'$ East along a spotted and
12 painted line for a distance of twenty-five hundred and
13 sixty-one (2,561) feet more or less to a wooden post
14 standing in a pile of stones and inscribed "CSM 1949
15 W/A";

16 Thence same course along a spotted and painted
17 line for a distance of three thousand three hundred and
18 four (3,304) feet more or less to the westerly end of a
19 stone wall located on the easterly bank of Swett Brook,
20 so-called;

21 Thence same course along the last mentioned stone
22 wall and spotted and painted line for a distance of six
23 hundred and fifty-five (655) feet more or less to a cut
24 granite post which stands on the westerly side of the
25 Hunt's Corner Road, sometimes called Pumping Station
26 Road;

27 Thence same course crossing said road and along a
28 spotted and painted line for a distance of two hundred
29 and ninety-six (296) feet more or less to the westerly
30 end of a stone wall;

31 Thence North 70° East along the last mentioned
32 stone wall and a spotted and painted line for a dis-
33 tance of twenty-three hundred and seventy-five (2,375)
34 feet more or less to a cut granite post inscribed "W/A"
35 and a wooden post inscribed "W/A 1949 CSM" which stand
36 in the intersection of two stone walls;

37 Thence same course along a spotted and painted
38 line for a distance of fourteen hundred and seven
39 (1,407) feet more or less to a square cut wooden post
40 standing in a pile of stones;
