9 10	Amend the bill by inserting before the enacting the clause the following:
11 12 13	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
14 15 16 17	Whereas, modern communications, transportation and municipal organization have substantially changed the nature of forest fire fighting and the capacity of governmental units and private landowners to respond to forest fires; and
18 19 20	Whereas, investigation of modern developments and current governmental organization is necessary to properly evaluate the status of state fire fighting services; and
21 22 23	Whereas, it is necessary that this investigation begin sooner than 90 days after the adjournment of the Legislature; and
24 25 26 27 28	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
29 30	Further amend the bill in section 1 by adding at the end the following:
31 32 33 34	'6. Withdrawal. The municipality shall be considered withdrawn from the Maine Forestry District on April 1st of the year following the effective date of legislation providing for the municipality's withdrawal.

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Further amend the bill by striking out everything after section 2 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 3. Maine Forest Fire Control Study Commission established. There is created a Maine Forest Fire Control Study Commission, known in this section as the "commission."

The commission shall be composed of 13 members as fol-Three members of the Legislature, one appointed by the President of the Senate and 2 appointed by the Speaker of the House; one member representing the Department of Conservation to be appointed by the commissioner; 3 municipal officials appointed by the Maine Municipal Association, from a municipality within the Maine Forestry District, one from a heavily forested municipality outside the district and one from an urban area; one member appointed by the Maine Forest Products Council; one member appointed by the Paper Industry Information Office; one member appointed by the Maine Fire Chiefs' Association; and 3 public members without connection to the forest products industry, one of whom resides in the unorganized territory, appointed by the Governor. The members shall be appointed in a timely manner and the commission shall hold an organizational meeting within 30 days after the adjournment of the Legislature at the call of the Chairman of the Legislative Council. this meeting the commission shall elect a chairman and a vice-chairman from within the membership.

The commission shall: Review the organization, administration, funding and delivery of state forest fire control services, including present local capabilities for forest fire control, and review alternatives to forest fire prevention and suppression, including technique used in other states; identify the most modern, effective and cost efficient method for providing forest fire control services within the State utilizing and coordinating local resources; and make any other studies and evaluations necessary to fully assess existing laws and information relating to forest fire control.

The commission shall report its findings, together with any suggested legislation, to the 111th Legislature on or before January 14, 1983.

The commission is authorized to contract for staff sup-

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2 port in conducting its functions.

3 Members, except state employees, shall receive reimbursement for the necessary actual expenses incurred in 4 carrying out the purposes of this commission.

All executive departments are directed to give prompt 6 7 assistance to the commission.

The commission is authorized to accept funds from any agency of the United States.

10 Sec. 4. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of 11 12 this Act. These funds may be carried over to fiscal year 13 1982-83 until the commission's purposes are fulfilled.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in 17 18 the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

19 STATEMENT OF FACT

20 This amendment removes provisions changing reimbursement to municipalities within the Maine Forestry District and liability for forest fire fighting costs for municipali-ties outside the district. It provides for the establish-21 22 23 ment of a commission to study state forest fire control ser-24 25 vices to assure efficiency in organization, administration 26 and delivery and adds an emergency preamble so the commis-27 sion can begin its investigation sooner than 90 days after 28 adjournment of the Legislature.
