19	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

By Public Law 1981, chapter 514, section 7, the Legislature directed the Workers' Compensation Commission to conduct a study of the feasibility of instituting a data input and retrieval system. From the results of the report, submitted to the Joint Standing Committee on Labor, the Legislature determines that such a system should be acquired.
27 28 29	Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

6 7 8	This bill provides for the acquisition of a data input and retrieval system for the Workers' Compensation Commission.
9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17	Maine's recognition of the need for a comprehensive information system was expressed in an Executive Order of March 21, 1980, calling for the commission, with the assistance of the Bureau of Labor, to study the use of such systems in an effort to improve administration. In that year, a preliminary needs analysis was conducted. Subsequently, in the First Regular Session of the 110th Legislature, an appropriation for an indepth feasibility study was approved. This measure completes the process of bringing the commission's capabilities up to date.
