22	STATEMENT OF FACT
23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30	This bill repeals that subsection of the state purchasing statute known as the Maine bid preference law. Currently, under this law, if a Maine firm's bid is within 5% of that of an out-of-state firm that is the lowest bidder, the Maine firm will be given the bid if it will reduce its bid to meet that of the out-of-state firm. While the bid preference program has helped some Maine firms it has also hurt others whose bids on state projects in other states are

1 2	being categorically rejected by those states in retaliation for Maine's bid preference law.
	This bill does not affect the existing bid preference offered to bidders who are Maine sheltered workshops.
