22	STATEMENT OF FACT
23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30	This bill permits the Attorney General and all private litigants to sue interstate businesses for their acts and practices which violate the Unfair Trade Practices Act. Most consumer goods and services sold in Maine are the products of interstate businesses. If these businesses and manufacturers injure Maine citizens, they should not be exempt from penalties under the Maine Unfair Trade Practices Act simply because they do business in other states or have

- 1 their headquarters outside of Maine.
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
