17 **AN ACT to Revise the Allocation of Funds**
18 **to Provide Photographic Nonalterable Driver's**
19 **Licenses and Identification Cards.**

21 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legislature
22 do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment
23 unless enacted as emergencies; and

24 Whereas, the next fiscal year will begin before the
25 90-day period terminates, and funds must be made available
26 prior to that time to carry out the intent of this legis-
27 lation; and

28 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these
29 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Consti-
30 tution of Maine and require the following legislation as
31 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public
32 peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

33 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

1 PL 1981, c. 506, §§5 and 6 are repealed and the follow-
2 ing enacted in their place:

3 Sec. 5. Allocation. The following funds are allocated
4 from the Highway Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

10 Sec. 6. Effective date. Section 5 of this Act shall
11 take effect on January 1, 1982. Sections 1 to 4 of this Act
12 shall take effect on July 1, 1982.

13 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in
14 the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

15 STATEMENT OF FACT

16 Public Law 1981, chapter 506 provides for a photo-
17 graphic, nonalterable driver's licenses and identification
18 care to be effective July 1, 1982. In order for this pro-
19 gram to be put into effect certain planning, developing of
20 forms, procedures and hiring of personnel must go into
21 effect prior to July 1, 1982. The present law, as it is
22 written, does not permit the expenditure of funds until
23 after July 1, 1982. In addition, the allocation of funds
24 are normally provided to the Secretary of State, Motor Vehi-
25 cle Division, as unallocated.

26 This change does not require allocation of additional
27 moneys, but simply sets forward from July 1, 1982, to the
28 date of enactment of this bill the effective date of Public
29 Law 1981, chapter 506, as it relates to Motor Vehicle Divi-
30 sion moneys only.
