19	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
20 21	28 MRSA §2, sub-§20, as repealed and replaced by PL 1975, c. 741, §1, is amended to read:
22 23 24	$\underline{20.~\text{Table}~\text{wine.}}$ "Table wine" means any wine containing not more than $\underline{14\%}~\underline{14.5\%}$ alcohol by volume, including sparkling wines.
25	STATEMENT OF FACT
26 27 28 29 30	The statutes define wine as any liquor produced by natural fermentation. Several wineries have changed their fermentation process so that the alcoholic content sometimes exceeds the statutory limit of 14%. Some Maine wholesalers have had wine shipped to them with an alcoholic content of

- 14.2%. Passage of this bill would make it possible for them to legally sell this wine.
