16 **AN ACT Relating to State Entitlement of**
17 **Certain School Administrative Districts.**

19 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

20 20 MRSA §4749, sub-§3, ¶C, first sentence, as amended
21 by PL 1979, c. 568, §4, is further amended to read:

22 The amount subtracted under paragraph B may not exceed
23 90% of the unit's entitlement for the year prior to the
24 year of allocation, ~~or~~ the base year or the year of
25 allocation, whichever is less.

Statement of Fact

2 The phase out of United States Public Law 874, provided
3 for by congressional action, means that United States Public
4 Law 874 receiving districts will have more funds subtracted
5 from their state entitlement than they will receive in
6 United States Public Law moneys. Districts enrolling B
7 pupils only have already experienced the problem. This bill
8 resolves the problem.
