15 AN ACT to Accept Relinquishment of Exclu-
16 sive Federal Jurisdiction Over Marshall
17 Point Light Station in the Town of
18 St. George.

20 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

21 Acceptance of federal relinquishment of exclusive
22 jurisdiction; Marshall Point Light Station. In accordance
23 with the provisions of the Revised Statutes, Title 1,
24 section 8, the State of Maine hereby accepts the relinquish-
25 ment by the United States of exclusive legislative jurisdic-
26 tion over Marshall Point Light Station in the Town of St.
27 George and County of Lincoln, bounded as follows:

28 Beginning at the high water mark at the point called
29 Marshall's Point, approximately N. 55°, 51'W and S.55°,
30 55'E; thence running northwardly, carrying the full width of
31 the land between high water mark on the easterly side and
32 the high water mark on the westerly side of said point, so
33 far as to contain 4 acres, together with the land from high
34 water mark to low water mark.

1 Upon this Act taking effect, the State of Maine shall
2 acquire concurrent jurisdiction over these premises with the
3 United States.

4 A copy of the notice of relinquishment of exclusive
5 federal jurisdiction is attached hereto and made a part
6 hereof.

7 STATEMENT OF FACT

8 The purpose of this bill is to accept concurrent legis-
9 lative jurisdiction with the Federal Government over
10 Marshall Point Light Station.
