6 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 2072, L.D. 2020, Bill,
7 "AN ACT to Revise the Military Laws of the State."

8 Amend the bill by striking out everything after the
9 enacting clause and inserting in its place the following:

10 'Sec. 1. 37-A MRSA, §938, as enacted by PL 1971, c.
11 580, §1, is amended by adding after the first sentence a new
12 sentence to read:

13 For purposes of Title 39, section 62, federal pay and bene-
14 fits received by the member as a result of any such wound,
15 injury or disease shall be considered to be derived from the
16 employer and will constitute a setoff to compensation
17 derived as a result of this section.

18 Sec. 2. 37-A MRSA §1320, sub-§2, as reallocated by PL
19 1971, c. 580, §3, is amended to read:

20 2. Qualifications. A military judge shall be a com-
21 missioned officer of the National Guard, reserve component
22 or a retired officer of the Armed Forces of the United
23 States who is a member of the bar of the Supreme Judicial
24 Court of Maine and who is certified to be qualified for such
25 duty by the State Judge Advocate.

26 Sec. 3. 37-A MRSA §1405, first sentence, as enacted by
27 PL 1977, c. 562, §1, is amended to read:

28 Veterans desiring admission to the home shall make
29 application on forms prescribed by the administrator and
30 admission will be made by the administrator only to veterans
31 who were residents of Maine at the time of their entry into
32 the Armed Forces of the United States or who ~~have been~~ are
33 residents of Maine at least 3 years prior to requesting
34 admission the time of application, and the spouses of such
35 veterans, providing suitable facilities are available.'

5 fication of the military laws.
