21 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

22 **Sec. 1. Block grant authorization.** In accordance with  
23 the Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1670, the Department  
24 of Educational and Cultural Services is authorized, effective  
25 July 1, 1982, to accept federal block grants in the  
26 following total amount:

31 **Sec. 2. Block grant allocation.** In order to provide  
32 for necessary expenditures of State Government and other

1 purposes for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1983, the fol-  
 2 lowing sums, as designated in the following translations,  
 3 are allocated from the revenues derived from federal block  
 4 grants. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, all  
 5 federal block grant allocations included in the Part shall  
 6 be subject to Revised Statutes, Title 5, Section 1585.

10 Provides for federal require-  
 11 ment to distribute 80% of all  
 12 state block grant funds to  
 13 local educational agencies

28 STATEMENT OF FACT

29 The purpose of this bill is to obtain necessary legis-  
30 lative approval to accept and allocate federal funds which  
31 are required to satisfy certain program funding needs of the  
32 Department of Educational and Cultural Services.

33 Section 1 authorizes the acceptance of, and adjustments  
34 to, certain federal block grants expected to be received  
35 during federal fiscal year 1982, which encompass state  
36 fiscal year 1983, as required in the Revised Statutes, Title  
37 5, section 1670.
