21	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
22 23 24 25 26	Sec. 1. Block grant authorization. In accordance with the Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1670, the Department of Educational and Cultural Services is authorized, effec- tive July 1, 1982, to accept federal block grants in the following total amount:

31 32	Sec. 2. Block grant allocation. In order to provide for necessary expenditures of State Government and other

4	grants. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, all
5	federal block grant allocations included in the Part shall

28	STATEMENT OF FACT
29	The purpose of this bill is to obtain necessary legis-
30	lative approval to accept and allocate federal funds which
31	are required to satisfy certain program funding needs of the
32	Department of Educational and Cultural Services.
33	Section 1 authorizes the acceptance of, and adjustments
34	to, certain federal block grants expected to be received
35	during federal fiscal year 1982, which encompass state
36	fiscal year 1983, as required in the Revised Statutes, Title
37	5, section 1670.

1 Section 2 makes allocations of such funds to specific 2 state and local education agencies for state fiscal year 3 1983.

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
