16 AN ACT to Provide for Mandatory Jail
17 Sentences for Repeat Offenders who Commit
18 Certain Crimes on or to a Person 60 Years
19 of Age or Older.

21 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

22 17-A MRSA §1252, sub-§7 is enacted to read:

23 7. Notwithstanding any other provision of this code,
24 if any Class A, B or C crime set out in chapter 9, 11, 15,
25 17 or 27 is committed against a person 60 years of age or
26 older, when that crime is the 2nd or subsequent such crime
27 committed by that person against a person 60 years of age or
28 older, the minimum sentence of imprisonment, which shall not
29 be suspended, shall be as follows. When the sentencing
30 class for that crime is Class A, the minimum term of impris-
31 onment shall be 4 years; when the sentencing class for that
32 crime is Class B, the minimum term of imprisonment shall be
33 2 years; and when the sentencing class for that crime is

1 Class C, the minimum term of imprisonment shall be one year.

2 STATEMENT OF FACT

3 The purpose of this bill is to provide for minimum
4 terms of imprisonment for repeated crimes committed against
5 persons 60 years of age or older.
