If the area most reasonably convenient for that purpose is insufficient to accommodate every person notifying him, the warden may limit the number of persons collecting signatures there, provided that the limitation applies equally to each petition question and that no petition group represented by a person notifying him is excluded from the area altogether.

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- 3. Nonreserved area. Any person may collect signatures on initiative or referendum petitions in the voting place, except that persons entitled under this section to collect signatures in the area reserved under subsection 2 shall have priority in that area.
- 4. Limitations. This section shall be subject to the limitations in section 891.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill improves the ability of election wardens to cope with the increasing number of people circulating petitions at the polling place on election day. Under bill, persons wishing to collect petition signatures at the polls are encouraged to notify the warden in advance so that the warden can provide them with a suitable area. best area is not large enough to accommodate everyone notifying him, the warden may limit the number of circulators in the area. The limitation must apply equally to each petition question and no petition group that is represented by someone who has preregistered may be excluded altogether. Persons who have not notified the warden in advance may still collect signatures in the voting place the reserved area. Collection priority in signatures under this bill remains subject to current provisions on activity at the polling place, including the proagainst interference with the free passage of hibition voters.

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
