8 9	Amend the Bill by striking out all of section 3 and inserting in its place the following:
10	'Sec. 3. 26 MRSA §979-D, sub-§6 is enacted to read:
11 12 13 14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23	6. Open bargaining. Collective bargaining for comprehensive agreements under this chapter shall be open to the public. Collective bargaining for comprehensive agreements includes negotiations, mediation, fact-finding and interest arbitration. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, notice of the proceedings shall consist of a posting giving the time, place, parties and general subject matter at issue, no later than one day in advance at a conspicuous location in the Statehouse. All bargaining covered by this provision shall take place in the State. The right of the public to attend these sessions as provided in this subsection does not include any right to comment or otherwise to actively participate in the proceedings.
24 25 26	Meetings among the representatives of one party or between one party and a mediator, fact-finder or interest arbitrator shall not be open to the public.
27	STATEMENT OF FACT
28 29 30 31 32	This amendment addresses 2 concerns voiced in opposition to the bill. First, it requires meetings which would be required to be open to the public to be held in this State. This is to assure that the purpose of the bill is not thwarted by holding sessions outside of Maine.
33 34 35	Second, the amendment assures that the bargaining pro- cess does not devolve into a "carnival-like atmosphere" by the injection of public comment into the sessions. The
