| _ | Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature lo not become effective until 90 days after adjournment inless enacted as emergencies; and |
| i | Whereas, Atlantic salmon are returning to Maine rivers n record numbers; and |
| | Whereas, the number of persons fishing for Atlantic almon has also increased dramatically, and this fishing ressure may endanger the restoration effort; and |
| С | Whereas, when the fishing season opens on May 1st, here will be no controls on taking Atlantic salmon in oastal waters, unless this legislation is enacted as an mergency; and |

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

6 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6504 is enacted to read:

§6504. Atlantic salmon

- 9 1. Stamp required. It is unlawful for any person to fish for Atlantic salmon from the areas indicated in subsection 2, or take, possess, ship or transport fish taken from these waters without a current Atlantic salmon stamp described in section 7152.
- 2. Limit of application. This requirement applies to all inland waters and to the following coastal waters, from the head of tide downstream to the line indicated:
- 17 A. Sheepscot River, above the Wiscasset-Edgecomb U.S.
 Route 1 bridge;
- 19 B. Dennys River, above the upstream side of the U.S.
 20 Route 1 bridge;
- 21 C. Kennebec River, above the upstream side of the 22 Route 197 bridge between Richmond and Dresden;
- D. East Machias River, above a line extending from Simpson's Wharf due south to the opposite shore on the Rim;
- E. Machias River, above the upstream side of the Rim
 Bridge, lower-most bridge on the Machias River;
- F. Pleasant River, above the upstream side on the main river bridge in Addison;
- G. Narraguagus River, above the upstream side on the U.S. Route 1A bridge in Milbridge;
- H. Union River, above a line extending from the southern extremity of the Ellsworth city boat launch ramp due west to the opposite shore of the Union River;
- Joshua Chamberlain Bridge in Bangor; and

- J. Ducktrap River, above the 3 red posts set on the shores approximately 1,000 feet downstream from the U.S. Route 1 bridge.
- 4 Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §6553, sub-§§6 and 7 are enacted to 5 read:
- 6. Bag limit. It is unlawful to take more than one Atlantic salmon in one day from inland waters or coastal waters designated in section 6504.
- 9 Tags. Any Atlantic salmon taken from inland waters or coastal waters designated in section 6504 must be identi-10 fied with a tag bearing the stamp number of the person who 11 caught the fish. Ten of these tags shall be issued 12 each Atlantic salmon stamp described in section 7152. 13 14 unlawful for any person to have in his possession an Atlantic salmon that has not been so tagged 15 while fishing 16 inland coastal waters. This waters or subsection 17 repealed March 1, 1984.
- 18 Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §7152, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1979, 19 c. 420, §1, is amended to read:
- 20 <u>1. Issuance.</u> The commissioner shall issue, in the 21 form of a stamp, an Atlantic salmon permit to fish for 22 Atlantic salmon in inland waters <u>and coastal waters designated</u> in section 6504.
- 24 Sec. 4. 12 MRSA §7152, sub-§3, ¶¶A and B, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 420, §1, are amended to read:
- 26 A. The fee for an Atlantic salmon permit shall be \$1 27 $\frac{4}{4}$ for any resident 16 years of age or older.
- 28 <u>B.</u> The fee for an Atlantic salmon permit shall be \$15 29 \$30 for any nonresident 16 years of age or older.
- 30 Sec. 5. 12 MRSA §7152, sub-§§4 and 5, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 420, §1, are amended to read:
- 32 Use of permit fees. All The first \$10,000 of proceeds, except for necessary expenses for issuing, from 33 34 permit fees shall be paid to the Atlantic Sea Run Salmon 35 Commission for the purposes of developing the Atlantic Sea 36 Run Salmon Restoration Program. The balance of the proceeds, less necessary expenses for issuing, shall be apportioned between the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wild-37 38 life and the Department of Marine Resources for the enforce-39 40 ment of Atlantic salmon fishing regulations.

5. Signing and affixing stamp. Immediately after issuance of an Atlantic salmon permit, the purchaser shall sign it accross its face and affix it to the back of a current valid fishing license or a certificate for fishing designated coastal waters. This certificate shall be provided by the agent without additional charge.

Sec. 6. Termination. The fee increase in section 4 of this Act is repealed March 1, 1984.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved, except that Title 12, section 6553, subsection 7, and Title 12, section 7152, subsection 3, paragraph A and B, shall take effect January 1, 1983.

FISCAL NOTE

It is estimated that this new draft will result in additional dedicated revenue of \$15,000 to \$17,000 a year when implemented in 1983, which will be apportioned between the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and the Department of Marine Resources for the enforcement of Atlantic salmon fishing regulations.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This new draft delays implementation of the increase in Atlantic salmon stamp fees and a tagging system for one year so the administrative details can be worked out.
