12 13	'Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §542, as amended by PL 1981, c. 492, §§14 to 16, is further amended to read:
14	§542. Expiration
15 16 17 18 19 20	For persons who have not reached their 65th 80th birthday, all new and renewal licenses to operate motor vehicles shall expire at midnight on the license holder's 4th birthday next following the date of issuance of license. The fee for such license shall be \$16.
21 22 23 24 25 26	For persons who have reached their 65th 80th birthday, all new and renewal licenses to operate motor vehicles shall expire at midnight on the license helder's holder's 2nd birthday next following the date of issuance of license. The fee for such license shall be \$8.
27 28 29	A person born on February 29th shall, for the purposes of this section, be considered as born on March 1st.
30 31 32 33 34 35 36	The transition to the 4-year license for persons not yet 65 80 years old shall be made in the following manner: The Secretary of State shall devise a schedule whereby 1/2 of all of those renewal licenses shall be issued for 4 years issue a 4-year license upon the expiration of those 2-year licenses for persons not yet 80 years of age. 5 6	Further amend the bill by renumbering the sections to read consecutively.
7	STATEMENT OF FACT
8 9 10 11 12	The purpose of this amendment is to allow individuals 65 years and over, up to age 80, to be issued a 4-year operator's license. Currently, drivers 65 and over are only being issued a 2-year driver's license. This amendment would move the issue of a 2-year driver's license up to age 80 and over.
