23	Constitutional amendment. RESOLVED: Two-thirds
2 4 25	of each branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine
26	be proposed:
27	Constitution, Art. IX, §20 is enacted to read:
28	Section 20. Appropriation of funds to the Maine
29	State Retirement System. Based upon actuarial
30	reserve requirements, determined by the Board of
31	Trustees of the Maine State Retirement System, there
32	is appropriated and transferred to the Maine State
33	Retirement System, on an annual basis, amounts of
34	money which are sufficient in amount for the current
35	payment of the employer's costs of all current

charges relating to the Maine State Retirement System and which shall be credited to the appropriate funds of the Maine State Retirement System. Current charges shall not include any amounts paid out but not funded by the State as of June 30, 1977, for persons formerly subject to the Maine Revised Statutes of 1944, chapter 37, sections 212 to 220. The trustees may request, and there may be appropriated, amounts in excess of current charges.

Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved: That the city aldermen, town selectmen and plantation assessors of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

"Shall the Constitution of Maine be amended to maintain and protect the integrity of the Maine State Retirement System?"

legal voters of each city, town plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots shall be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment shall become part of the Constitution on the date of the proclamation.

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

STATEMENT OF FACT

2	The purpose of this constitutional resolution is
3	to make the appropriation of funds to the Maine State
4	Retirement System by the State of Maine for state
5	employee and teacher retirement costs mandatory on
6	the part of the executive and legislative branches of
7	State Government.

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
