20 21	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
22 23	12 MRSA §6173, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 661, §5, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
24	§6173 Confidentiality of statistics
25	The commissioner may, with the advice and consent
26	of the advisory council, adopt or amend regulations
27	to collect pertinent data with respect to the fish-
28	eries, including, but not limited to, information
29	regarding the type and quantity of fishing gear used,
30	catch by species in numbers of fish or weight

ity utilized by United States fish processors. The commissioner may collect statistics from any source and may require reporting of these statistics. The information collected by or reported to the commissioner shall be confidential and shall not be disclosed in a manner or form that permits identification of any person or vessel, except when required by court order. The commissioner shall by regulation prescribe such procedures as necessary to preserve confidentiality.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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The former confidentiality provisions concerning fisheries statistics have been revised to more closely parallel federal provisions. Similarity federal and state provisions is important in order to maximize federal and state cooperation in collection, analysis of regional fisheries stacompilation and tistics. The intent of this bill is to grant Commissioner of Marine Resources powers to collect, require reporting and protect the confidentiality of fisheries statistics, which are at least equal to those of federal fisheries authorities. The new legislation no longer prohibits the commissioner from maintaining fisheries statistics in unaggregated form, as scientific analysis may require long-term storage of unaggregated data. This new provision will not present any greater threat to the confidenindustry statistics, in that the tiality of unaggregated data is still protected from disclosure, except pursuant to court order.

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
