17 AN ACT to Permit Signs for Seasonal
18 Lobster Pounds under the Maine Traveler
19 Information Services' Law.

21 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
22 follows:

23 Sec. 1. 23 MRSA §1913-A, sub-§2, ¶¶D and E, as
24 enacted by PL 1981, c. 318, §3, are amended to read:

25 D. Signs erected by nonprofit historical and
26 cultural institutions. Each institution, which
27 has certified its nonprofit status with the com-
28 missioner, may erect not more than 2 signs with a
29 surface area not to exceed 50 square feet per
30 sign; and

31 E. Signs bearing political messages; and

32 Sec 2. 23 MRSA §1913-A, sub-§2, ¶F is enacted to
33 read:

1 F. Signs directing travelers to seasonal lobster
2 pounds. For purposes of this paragraph, a
3 seasonal lobster pound is a lobster pound oper-
4 ating between May 15th and October 15th, inclu-
5 sive.

6 STATEMENT OF FACT

7 The purpose of this bill is to permit signs
8 directing travelers to seasonal lobster pounds to be
9 erected without a license under the billboard law.

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
