The municipal officers shall require that a partic-ular article be placed in the next printed ballot. A vote to disapprove the comprehensive plan stands until it is superseded by a vote calling for the readoption of the comprehensive planning process. A question seeking readoption of the comprehensive planning process shall be proposed to the voters in the manner set forth in this subsection.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to permit voters in each town the opportunity to abandon the comprehensive planning process. In some of the small communities, there is little desire to undertake comprehensive planning, but statutory law requires it, forcing townspeople to engage in processes for which they have neither interest nor use. Under this bill, if a majority of the voters reject adoption of a comprehensive plan, no further planning of this sort need be undertaken until such time, if ever, townspeople choose to readopt comprehensive planning.
