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SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to S.P. 29, L.D. 84,
Bill, "AN ACT Relating to Business, Travel or Recrea-
tion on Sunday."

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Amend the bill by adding before the Statement of
Fact the following:

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'In no event may an employer who otherwise could
not keep open a place of business to the public on a
Sunday, but who may keep that business open on Sun-
days between Thanksgiving and Christmas, require a
full-time employee on or before the effective date of
this subsection, as amended, to work on Sunday as a
condition of employment.'

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Any employer shall pay each employee working on
Sunday 1 1/2 times the regular hourly wage rate for
each Sunday worked if that employee has worked at
least 30 hours in the week preceding that Sunday.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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
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The purpose of this amendment is to prevent regular full-time employees from being required to work on Sunday as a condition of employment. It also requires that time and 1/2 be paid to any employee who works on Sunday if the employee has worked at least 30 hours in the preceding week.
