STATE OF MAINE 2 3 SENATE 4 111TH LEGISLATURE 5 FIRST REGULAR SESSION COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 43, L.D. 101, 6 Bill, "AN ACT to Clarify the "Hearing Ear" Dog Law." 7 8 Amend the bill by inserting after the enacting 9 clause the following: 10 'Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3612, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 584, §5, is amended to read: 11 3. <u>Guide dogs.</u> Every deaf or hearing impaired person shall have the right to be accompanied by a 12 13 guide dog, described and known as a "hearing ear" 14 dog, especially trained for the purpose, and identi-15 fied by a bright erange collar and leash colored 16 17 hunter orange, as that color is defined in Title 12, 18 section 7001, subsection 16, in any of the places listed in subsection 2 without being required to pay 19 20 an extra charge for the guide dog, provided that he shall be liable for any damage done to the premises 21 or facilities by that dog. When the deaf or hearing 22 23 impaired person is accompanied by a guide dog, he shall also carry a card, issued by the Bureau of Re-24 25 habilitation, which states that the dog is an especially trained guide dog, and cites Title 22, sec-tions 3611 and 3612 as allowing for access by the person and his dog to streets, public places and 26 27 28 public conveyances.' 29 30 Further amend the bill by inserting at the beginning of the first line after the enacting clause the 31 32 abbreviation and figure 'Sec. 2.'

34 The amendment alters the statement in the current 35 law that the hearing ear dog's collar and leash be 8

1 "bright orange" to read that it be colored hunter 2 orange. The definition referred to is that in the 3 fisheries and wildlife statutes which defines the 4 color hunter orange as "a daylight fluorescent orange 5 color with a dominant wave between 595 and 605 6 nanometers, excitation purity not less than 85% and 1 uminance factor of not less than 40%."
