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trustee, and whenever any of the trustees becomes a member of the Caribou city council, or any body of officers acting in the capacity of the present council, he shall automatically cease to be such trustee. As soon as convenient after the members of the board have been appointed, the trustees shall hold a meeting in the City of Caribou, and organize by the election of a president and clerk, and choose a treasurer and, when necessary, all other needful officers and agents, who, with the treasurer, shall serve at their pleasure and whose compensation shall be fixed by the trustees. Whenever a vacancy occurs in the office of president, clerk or treasurer, it shall be promptly filled by the board of trustees. At the first meeting, they may determine by agreement, or failing to agree they shall determine by lot, the term of office of each trustee so that one or 2 shall retire each year, and the term of office of the first trustee to expire shall end at the end of the municipal year of the City of Caribou following the acceptance of this Act, and thereafter the term of office of one or 2 trustees shall expire with the end of each municipal year and, whenever the term of office of a trustee expires, the body which appointed the trustee shall appoint a successor to serve the full term of 3 years and, in case any other vacancy arises from any cause, it shall be filled in like manner for the unexpired term. When any trustee ceases to be a resident of the City of Caribou, he vacates the office trustee. The trustees may also ordain and establish such bylaws as are necessary for their own convenience and the proper management of the affairs of the The trustees may procure an office and district. incur such expense as may be necessary. The treasurer shall furnish bond in such sum and with such sureties as they may approve. Members of the board shall be eligible to any office under the board, and shall be sworn into office by a notary public or the clerk of the City of Caribou.
