Publi	c Utilities Commission	shall establish condi-

tions of service, maintenance and repair of this equipment. This subsection shall apply only to the extent consistent with federal law.

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4. Telecommunications equipment fund; uses. Each telephone company authorized to do business in this State, having at least 100,000 local exchange customers, shall pay into a special telecommunications equipment fund \$40,000 not later than January 1, 1984, and every year thereafter, until and including January 1, 1989. The special telecommunication fund shall be held in trust by the Office of Deafness. The Public Utilities Commission shall include all incomes and payments made by a company into the fund as operating expenses of the company. The Office of Deafness shall invest all moneys within the fund in accordance with established investment practices and return all interest earned by these investments to the fund.

The Office of Deafness under the Bureau of Rehabilitation may draw on each fund in accordance with a plan developed by the Public Utilities Commission, and approved by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over public utilities. The plan shall be developed and adopted annually, not later than January 1st, after appropriate notice and hearing. The plan shall provide for the distribution of moneys from the funds to deaf and hearing and speech impaired persons for upgrading, maintenance and repair of special telecommunications equipment capable of serving their needs or to vendors providing equipment or servicing. plan shall also provide that not more than 10% of the moneys annually paid into each fund shall be allocated to the Public Utilities Commission to carry out its responsibilities under this subsection and not more than 5% of the moneys annually paid into a fund by a telephone company shall be allocated to that company to carry out its responsibilities under subsection 3. All moneys allocated to the commission shall be paid to the Treasurer of State for deposit in the General Fund.

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This bill provides that telephone companies make telecommunication equipment capable of serving the needs of deaf and hearing and speech impaired persons available for loan and be responsible for its maintenance and repair.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The bill also creates a fund from which moneys can be taken by the Office of Deafness to provide, upgrade and service special telecommunications equipment used by deaf and hearing and speech impaired persons.

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
