17 AN ACT to Reduce the Mandatory Number
18 of Election Clerks for Each Voting Place.
19

20 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
21 follows:

22 Sec. 1. 21 MRSA §532, sub-§1, as amended by PL
23 1975, c. 761, §25, is further amended to read:

24 1. Appointment. Not later than May 1st of each
25 general election year, the municipal officers of each
26 municipality shall appoint as election clerks for
27 each voting place an equal number of persons nomi-
28 nated by the municipal committees of the 2 major par-
29 ties. At the request of the municipal committee of
30 any minor party represented on the official ballot
31 used at the last general election, the municipal
32 officers shall appoint one election clerk for each
33 voting place nominated by that committee. The munici-
34 pal officers shall designate an equal number of elec-

1 tion clerks from each major party to issue ballots to
2 incoming voters and receive ballots of outgoing
3 voters.

4 Sec. 2. 21 MRSA §532, sub-§2, as amended by PL
5 1981, c. 87, is further amended to read:

6 2. Number appointed. The municipal officers
7 shall appoint ~~4~~ 2 election clerks for each voting
8 place in each municipality who must be residents of
9 the municipality.

10 A- Exception: They shall appoint 2 election
11 clerks for each voting place in a municipality of
12 300 or less population, in the island wards of
13 the City of Portland, the island district of the
14 Town of Cumberland and the districts of the Town
15 of Cranberry Isles.

16 B. Additional clerks. They may appoint addition-
17 al election clerks, if necessary, who are nomi-
18 nated as provided in subsection 1.

19 C. Alternate clerks. They shall appoint alter-
20 nate election clerks who are nominated as pro-
21 vided in subsection 1 and who may be called into
22 service by the warden, as needed, to fill a
23 vacancy on election day. In the event the munic-
24 ipal committee shall fail to nominate a suffi-
25 cient number of election clerks to perform the
26 duties prescribed by this Title, the clerk or
27 municipal officers shall appoint the necessary
28 number to fill the vacancy on election day.

29 D. Counters. The clerk may appoint a sufficient
30 number of election clerks, an equal number from
31 each political party, to serve as counters at the
32 close of polls who shall be paid a reasonable
33 compensation as determined by the municipal offi-
34 cers.

36 40, §§1 and 2, is further amended to read:

37 §861. Voting procedure

38 The voting procedure is as follows.

1 for many municipalities. This bill would reduce the
2 number of mandatory election clerks per voting place
3 to 2, but allows the municipal officers to appoint
4 additional clerks if they deem it necessary.
