20 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
21 follows:

22 § MRSA §351, 4th ¶, as repealed and replaced by
23 PL 1975, c. 394, §1, is amended to read:

24 The members of the commission shall receive no
25 salaries, but shall be allowed reasonable expenses in
26 the performance of their official duties not exceed-
27 ing \$5,000 per year in the case of the chairman and
28 \$3,500 in the case of each of the other commission-
29 ers. These expenses shall include a per diem of \$25
30 \$50 for each commission meeting attended, not to
31 exceed 20 such meetings in any fiscal year and such
32 other reasonable expenses incurred in attendance and
33 travel to and from such meetings.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill increases the per diem of lottery commissioners from \$25 to \$50 per meeting attended. The commissioner's per diem allowance has been \$25 since 1975. There is no need for increasing the allocation to the State Lottery Commission as the increased cost, estimated at \$1,200, can be absorbed within the current allocation.
