17 AN ACT Relating to Common Recreational
18 Facilities for the Residents of
19 Frye Island.
20

21 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
22 follows:

23 P&SL 1975, c. 138, §5, first sentence is amended
24 to read:

25 The corporation is authorized and vested with the
26 power, at any legal meeting called for the purpose,
27 to raise the sums of money necessary for the follow-
28 ing purposes: To construct, maintain and repair
29 roads, streets, ways and sidewalks; to procure water
30 for fire, domestic and other purposes, to provide or
31 procure sewer and refuse disposal facilities, and to
32 provide light for public use; to establish and main-
33 tain police and fire protection; to build, repair and
34 maintain public wharves and landings; to purchase,

1 maintain and operate ferries or boats for trans-
2 portation from the island to the mainland; to provide
3 and maintain common recreational facilities for the
4 residents of Frye Island; to purchase, construct,
5 maintain and repair such buildings and equipment as
6 may be necessary or desirable for such purposes; to
7 acquire by purchase or gift, and by deed, will, lease
8 or otherwise title to real estate and personal prop-
9 erty for the benefit of the corporation; to manage,
10 operate, mortgage, sell, lease and exchange real
11 estate and personal property for the benefit of the
12 corporation; to contract with any individual firm,
13 association or corporation to accomplish such pur-
14 poses; and to pay salaries and expenses of the corpo-
15 ration.

16 STATEMENT OF FACT

17 The present activities of the Frye Island Municipi-
18 pal Services Corporation are limited to essential
19 services including ferry service, road maintenance
20 and the provision of water, rubbish removal and
21 security. The common recreational activities includ-
22 ing public beaches, a swimming pool, tennis courts
23 and a nine hole golf course must be operated sepa-
24 rately. The residents are interested in seeking
25 permission to operate these recreational facilities
26 under the aegis of the Municipal Services Corporation
27 just as towns and villages operate public beaches,
28 tennis courts, etc. for their residents.

29 Adding community recreational activities to the
30 responsibilities of the Frye Island Municipal Ser-
31 vices Corporation would in no way modify the tax
32 income of Standish since the estates of the Municipal
33 Services Corporation on Frye Island are fully taxable
34 by the Town of Standish.
