## 16 STATEMENT OF FACT

The present activities of the Frye Island Municipal Services Corporation are limited to essential services including ferry service, road maintenance and the provision of water, rubbish removal and security. The common recreational activities including public beaches, a swimming pool, tennis courts and a nine hole golf course must be operated separately. The residents are interested in seeking permission to operate these recreational facilities under the aegis of the Municipal Services Corporation just as towns and villages operate public beaches, tennis courts, etc. for their residents.

Adding community recreational activities to the responsibilities of the Frye Island Municipal Services Corporation would in no way modify the tax income of Standish since the estates of the Municipal Services Corporation on Frye Island are fully taxable by the Town of Standish.
