AN ACT to Require Wholesale Malt Liquor
Prices to Remain in Effect for 90 Days.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

28 MRSA §655 is enacted to read:

§655. Minimum wholesale malt liquor price posting period

All certificate of approval holders and wholesale malt liquor licensees shall post their wholesale malt liquor prices with the commission at least 15 days in advance of any price change. Prices shall be posted on forms supplied by the commission and in a manner prescribed by the commission. Price changes may not become effective until the first day of the first month following the required 15-day notification period. Any wholesale malt liquor price posted with

1 the commission may not be changed until 90 days have
2 elapsed since the posted price became effective.

3 STATEMENT OF FACT

4 The purpose of this bill is to establish a 90-day
5 period during which malt liquor wholesalers and cer-
6 tificate of approval holders may not alter their
7 prices. Commission regulations currently require
8 only a 30-day period.

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
