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## STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to enable either an engineer or architect to serve as a prime professional with respect to design supervision and allied design work involved in projects of the Maine Housing Authority. This change in the law is proposed at time when recent modifications of HUD'S requirements for architectural services during the design and the inspection stages has been made in order to parallel the requirement or licensing procedures of state's boards of registration. With these modifications, architects, engineers, designers, etc., act as the prime professional during the design and construction stages of project development, provided that they are licensed to perform any professional service, such as investigation, evaluation, planning, design and responsible supervision of construction in connection with structures or buildings, that may be involved in project development.

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
