17 AN ACT to Provide for a Reduced Fee for
18 Lobster Fishing Licenses for Persons 70 years
19 of Age and Older.

21 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
22 follows:

23 12 MRSA §6421, sub-§7-A is enacted to read:

24 7-A. Limited license for persons 70 years of age
25 or older. A limited license may be issued to any
26 person 70 years of age or older. The fee for the
27 limited license is \$20. No person fishing with a
28 limited license may fish with more than 35 traps and
29 the license shall indicate on its face that the
30 licensee is limited to the use of no more than 35
31 traps at any one time.

The purpose of this bill is to provide for a limited lobster fishing license for persons 70 years of age or older. The fee for the license is \$20 and the person is limited to no more than 35 traps.
