AN ACT to Amend the Medicaid Copayment Law.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
22 MRSA §3173-C, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 703, Pt. A, §24, is further amended to read:
1. Prescription drug services. A payment of 50¢ is to be collected from the Medicaid recipient for
each drug prescription which is an approved Medicaid service, except prescriptions utilized for family
planning services, unless the Medicaid recipient is in the custody of the State or unless that recipient's income is assessed and applied to reduce
the cost of his medical care, or unless the prescription is to correct or ameliorate defects and chronic conditions discovered through the early and periodic
screening and diagnosis of individuals who are under

In those situations where the 50¢ copayment is exempt from being collected by this or other state statutes, state regulation or federal statutes or regulations, the Department of Human Services shall include the exempted 50¢ in its fee payment to the provider pharmacy.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

The Medicaid dispensing fee for prescription drugs is presently \$3.20. A pharmacy receives \$2.70 from the Department of Human Services, plus 50¢ from the recipient when it fills a Medicaid prescription, except when the recipient is exempt from the copayment, then the pharmacy receives the full \$3.20 from the department.

Recent changes in federal law may increase the number of people eligible for a copayment exemption, as well as adding confusion and difficulty to admin-

istering regulations regarding exemptions.

This bill insures that a pharmacy will receive the full \$3.20 dispensing fee when serving a Medicaid patient who is exempt by federal or state law or regulation.

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
