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Sec. 2. 30 MRSA §6206, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 732, §§1 and 31, is amended to read:

1. General powers. Except as otherwise provided this Act, the Passamaguoddy Tribe and Penobscot Nation, within their respective Indian territories, shall have, exercise and enjoy all the rights, privileges, powers and immunities, including, but without limitation, the power to enact ordinances and collect taxes, and shall be subject to all the duties, obligations, liabilities and limitations of a municipality of and subject to the laws of the State, provided , however, that internal tribal including membership in the respective tribe right to reside within the respective nation, the Indian territories, tribal organization, tribal ernment, tribal elections and the use or disposition of settlement fund income shall not be subject regulation by the State. The Passamaquoddy Tribe and the Penobscot Nation shall designate such officers and officials as are necessary to implement and administer those laws of the State applicable to respective Indian territories and the residents thereof, and shall each choose a nonvoting Representative to the Legislature, elected in accordance with their respective tribal laws. Any resident Passamaguoddy Indian territory or the Penobscot Indian territory who is not a member of the respectribe or nation nonetheless shall be equally entitled to receive any municipal or governmental services provided by the respective tribe or nation or by the State, except those services which are provided exclusively to members of the respective tribe or nation pursuant to state or federal law, and shall entitled to vote in national, state and county elections in the same manner as any tribal member residing within Indian territory.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Section 1 adds a paragraph to the present law to provide official notification to the Clerk of the
