17 AN ACT to Preclude Part-time Employees
18 of Nonprofit Organizations from Eligibility
19 under Unemployment Compensation if Employed
20 for less than 3 months.
21

22 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
23 follows:

24 Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §1192, sub-§7, ¶¶B and C, as
25 amended by PL 1977, c. 585, §2, is further amended to
26 read:

27 B. With respect to weeks of unemployment begin-
28 ning after December 31, 1977, in any other capac-
29 ity for an educational institution, other than an
30 institution of higher education as defined in
31 section 1043, subsection 25, benefits shall not
32 be paid on the basis of such services to any
33 individual for any week which commences during a
34 period between 2 successive academic years or

1 terms if such individual performs such services
2 in the first of such academic years or terms and
3 there is annual written reasonable assurance that
4 such individual will perform such services in the
5 2nd of such academic year or terms; and

6 C. With respect to weeks of unemployment begin-
7 ning after December 31, 1977, benefits shall be
8 denied to any individual for any week which com-
9 mences during an established and customary vaca-
10 tion period or holiday recess if such individual
11 performs any services described in ~~paragraphs~~
12 paragraph A or B in the period immediately before
13 such vacation period or holiday recess, and there
14 is annual written reasonable assurance that such
15 individual will perform any such services in the
16 period immediately following such vacation period
17 or holiday recess;

18 Sec. 2 26 MRSA §1192, sub-§7, ¶D, as enacted by
19 PL 1979, c. 515, §14, is amended to read:

20 D. With respect to weeks of unemployment begin-
21 ning after June 30, 1979, benefits shall be
22 denied to an individual who performed services in
23 an educational institution while in the employ of
24 an educational service agency for any week which
25 commences during a period described in paragraphs
26 A, B and C if that individual performs any ser-
27 vices described in ~~paragraphs~~ paragraph A or B in
28 the first of these periods, as specified in the
29 applicable paragraph, and there is a contract or
30 a reasonable assurance as applicable in the
31 appropriate paragraph, that the individual will
32 perform these services in the 2nd of these
33 periods, as applicable in the appropriate para-
34 graph. For purposes of this paragraph, the term
35 "educational service agency" means a governmental
36 agency or governmental entity which is estab-
37 lished and operated exclusively for the purposes
38 of providing these services to one or more educa-
39 tional institutions; and

40 Sec. 3. 26 MRSA §1192, sub-§7, ¶E is enacted to
41 read:

1 E. With respect to part-time employees of non-
2 profit organizations who were employed for less
3 than 3 months, benefits shall not be payable.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

5 The purpose of this bill is to make ineligible
6 for unemployment compensation part-time employees of
7 nonprofit organizations who worked with those orga-
8 nizations for less than 3 months.

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
