for such administration and investigation. All employees shall be considered as employees of the State and subject to all the provisions of state regarding state employees and shall be employed under the rules and regulations established by the Personnel Board and shall receive such compensation provided by the rules and regulations of the Personnel Board for state employees in similar capacities. necessary expenses incurred by the board and executive director in the operation of the retirement system shall be paid from the funds so allocated. 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STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to allow the executive director to employ an actuary as a member of the professional staff of the retirement system. The staff actuary will report to the executive director rather than to the board of trustees of the retirement system. This bill does not preclude the board of trustees from contracting for outside actuarial services.

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
