1 the United States and who has been in the active 2 practice of law in that jurisdiction, or any other jurisdiction in the United States to which he was 3 4 appropriately admitted, for a period of at least 3 5 years one year. When an applicant shall have satis-6 fied the board that the foregoing requirements have 7 been fulfilled and has paid a fee fixed by the board and approved by the Supreme Judicial Court, he shall 8 9 be eligible to take such written examination prepared 10 adopted by the board and such oral examination as or 11 the board deems appropriate to determine whether or 12 not such applicant has the qualifications required by this chapter for admission to the bar. Upon such 13 examination being completed, the board shall issue to 14 15 each applicant who received the passing grade established by the board, or better, and who has satisfied the requirements and qualifications set forth in this 16 17 18 chapter, a certificate of qualification recommending 19 his admission to the bar.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide that in order to practice law in Maine, an attorney from another jurisdiction must have been practicing for one year rather than for 3 years as required by the current law.
