NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend the Charter of the
Winthrop Water District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

P&SL 1923, c. 98, §16 is amended to read:

Sec. 16. Incidental powers granted. All incidental powers, rights and privileges necessary to the accomplishment of the main object herein set forth in this section are granted to the public municipal corporation hereby created in this section. Any person who places, discharges or leaves any offensive or injurious matter or material on or in the sewer conduits, catch basins or sewer receptacles of the district contrary to its sewer use regulations, or knowingly injures any sewer conduit, pipe, reservoir, flush tank, catch basin, manhole, outlet, engine, pump or other property held, owned or used by the

1 district for sewer purposes is liable to pay twice
2 the amount of the damage to the district, to be re-
3 covered in any proper action and that person is
4 guilty of a Class E crime.

5 STATEMENT OF FACT

6 This bill amends the charter of the Winthrop
7 Water District to provide for specific civil liabil-
8 ity for any person who tampers with or damages dis-
9 trict property. Such activity is also made a Class E
10 crime.
