24	REGISTRATION OF OFF-ROAD
25	MOTORCYCLE-TYPE VEHICLES
26	§7851. Definitions
27 28 29	As used in this subchapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.

1 <u>1. Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the Com-</u> 2 missioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife.

- 2. Department. "Department" means the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife.
 - 3. Off-road motorcycle-type vehicle. "Off-road motorcycle-type vehicle" means a motor driven vehicle with a motorcycle design intended for off-road use only and includes minibikes, trail bikes, so-called dirt bikes and any other 2, 3 or more wheeled motor driven vehicles intended for off-road use only. Off-road motorcycle-type vehicle does not include:
- 12 A. Any vehicle used exclusively for scheduled 13 racing events and operated solely on race tracks, 14 which, but for such use, would be included under 15 this definition; and
 - B. Motorcycles, motor driven cycles, mopeds or motorized bicycles or tricycles, as those terms are defined in Title 29, section 1.
- 19 §7852. Registration of off-road motorcycle-type
 20 vehicles

Except as provided elsewhere in this subchapter, no person may operate an off-road motorcycle-type vehicle in this State, unless it is registered pursuant to this subchapter. The commissioner or his designee shall register and assign a registration number to all off-road motorcycle-type vehicles upon application and payment of an annual \$10 registration fee by the owner. A registration shall be valid for one year, commencing July 1st of each year.

§7853. Collection and expenditure of registration fees

All moneys collected by the department shall be expended for the cost of administration and enforcement of this subchapter. If any moneys are not expended for the administration and enforcement of this subchapter during the year in which they are collected, the commissioner may provide funds, upon request and in order of application, to political subdivisions, educational institutions and to

off-road motorcycle-type vehicle organizations for the construction, acquisition or maintenance of off-road motorcycle trails and for the establishment of educational and safety programs for operators of off-road motorcycle-type vehicles. Any moneys not expended in the year in which they are collected for the purposes described shall be deposited in the Highway Fund.

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42 43 §7854. Transfer or discontinued use of registered off-road motorcycle-type vehicles.

Whenever ownership is transferred or the use is discontinued of an off-road motorcycle-type vehicle for which a registration certificate has already been issued, the old registration certificate shall be properly signed and executed by the owner, showing that the ownership of the off-road vehicle has been transferred or its use discontinued, and returned to the department within 10 days of the event. If there is a change of ownership of an off-road motorcycle-type vehicle for which a registration certificate number has previously been issued, the new owner shall apply for a new registration certificate and shall include the original number in the application. He shall pay the regular registration fee. The holder of any registration certificate issued under this section may obtain a duplicate from the department upon application and payment of a fee of

- 1. Transfer fee. Whoever transfers the ownership or permanently discontinues the use of a registered off-road motorcycle-type vehicle and applies for registration of another off-road motorcycle-type vehicle in the same year shall be entitled to a certificate of registration upon payment of a transfer fee of \$2 and shall not be charged the regular registration fee.
- 37 §7855. Off-road motorcycle-type vehicle operated on vehicle owner's property
 - No registration may be required for an off-road motorcycle-type vehicle operated solely over the property owned or leased by the owner, provided that the off-road vehicle is not operated elsewhere within the jurisdiction of the State.

§7856. Rules

The commissioner shall promulgate rules, in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, concerning the registration of off-road motorcycle-type vehicles to include the method and procedure of registration, the issuance of registration plates or other identifying insignia and the revocation or suspension of off-road motorcycle-type vehicle registrations.

- 10 <u>1. Limitations on the operation of off-road</u>
 11 motorcycle-type vehicles. No person may operate an
 12 off-road motorcycle-type vehicle upon:
- A. Controlled access highways or within their right-of-way limits, except as provided in this subchapter; and
 - B. Private property over which travel has been forbidden.
- 2. <u>Limitations on the operation of off-road</u>
 motorcycle-type vehicles across public ways. Currently registered off-road motorcycle-type vehicles
 may:
 - A. Cross controlled access highways by use of bridges over or roads under those highways, or by use of roads crossing controlled access highways at grade. The Commissioner of Transportation may issue special permits for designated crossings of controlled access highways; and
 - B. Operate on a public way only for the distance necessary, but in no case to exceed 300 yards, for the purpose of crossing as directly as possible a public way, sidewalk or culvert. These vehicles may also operate on a public way only the distance necessary, but in no case to exceed 500 yards, for the sole purpose of crossing as directly as possible a bridge, overpass or underpass, provided that the operation can be made safely and that it does not interfere with vehicular traffic approaching from either direction on that way.

1 2	In crossing a public way or bridge, off-road motorcycle-type vehicles shall:
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3	(1) Be brought to a complete stop before
4	entering a public way;
5	(2) Yield the right-of-way to all vehicular
6	traffic on a way; and
7	(3) Cross as nearly as possible at a 90°
8	angle to the public way.
9	3. Rules of the Commissioner of Transporta-
10	tion. The Commissioner of Transportation, in accor-
11	dance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act,
12	Title 5, chapter 375, may promulgate rules pertaining
13	to the operation of off-road motorcycle-type vehicles
14	across and over public ways and bridges. The commis-
15	sioner may prohibit crossing of an individual bridge,
16	culvert, overpass or underpass, if he determines that
17	crossing or use of the public way is hazardous. Any
18	bridge, culvert, overpass or underpass closed by the
19	commissioner shall be posted.
20	§7857. Unlawful operation
21	1. It shall be unlawful to operate an off-road
22	motorcycle-type vehicle:
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23	A. In a reckless manner;
24	B. In an intoxicated condition as the result of
25	the use of intoxicating liquor or drugs. Stan-
26	dards, tests and procedures applicable in deter-
27	mining whether a person is under the influence
28	within the meaning of this section shall be those
29	applicable in Title 29, section 1312;
30	C. In a manner to endanger any person or prop-
31	erty;
32	D. At an unreasonable rate of speed;
33	E. On the property of another and who fails to
34	stop and identify himself upon the request of the

. 1 -	landowner or his duly authorized representative.

- 1 giving license or permission to cross or go onto 2 the property of another;
- 3 F. Without a headlamp in operation during the period from 1/2 hour after sunset to 1/2 hour 4 5 before sunrise or during periods when, due to insufficient light or unfavorable atmospheric 6 7 conditions, caused by fog or otherwise, other 8 persons, vehicles or other objects are not 9 clearly discernable for a distance of 500 feet 10 ahead;
- 11 G. In violation of an order by any law enforce-12 ment officer in uniform;
- H. Within 200 feet of any dwelling without specific permission of the owner, hospital, nursing home, convalescent home or church; or
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 I. Along or adjacent and parallel to the tracks
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 of any railroad within the limits of the railroad
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 right-of-way without written permission from the
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 railroad.

§7858. Accidents

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The operator of any off-road motorcycle-type vehicle involved in any accident resulting in injuries requiring the services of a physician, death of any person or property damage to the estimated amount of \$100 or more, within 24 hours of the accident, shall report the accident to the State Police, a warden of the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, the sheriff's office within the county in which the accident occurred or the police department of the municipality in which the accident occurred. Failure to report any accident as required by this subchapter shall be subject to the penalties of section 7860.

§7859. Enforcement

1. Enforcement officers. Every law enforcement officer in the State, including wardens of the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, wardens of the Department of Marine Resources, foresters and wardens of the Bureau of Forestry and supervisors and

- rangers of the Bureau of Parks and Recreation and Allagash Wilderness Waterway, shall enforce this subchapter.
- 4 2. Authority to stop off-road motorcycle-type 5 vehicles. Any law enforcement officer in uniform whose duty it is to enforce this subchapter may stop 6 7 and examine any off-road motorcycle-type vehicle for the purpose of ascertaining whether it is being oper-8 9 ated in compliance with this subchapter, and 10 officer may demand and inspect the operator's certificate of registration. He may also examine the iden-11 tification numbers of the vehicle and any registra-12 tion insignia that may be required. It is unlawful 13 14 for the operator of any off-road vehicle to fail or 15 refuse to stop that vehicle on request or signal of 16 any such officer.

§7860. Penalty

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Any person who violates any provision of this subchapter, or rule adopted pursuant to this subchapter, shall be guilty of a Class E Crime.

21 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires off-road motorcycle-type vehicles to be registered to operate in Maine. Vehicles registered and licensed to operate on public ways and designed to also operate as an off-road vehicle do not have to be registered as an off-road motorcycle-type vehicle.

This bill applies the snowmobiles laws, in general, to off-road motorcycle-type vehicles. Off-road motorcycle-type vehicles may cross a public way, but cannot travel on a public way in excess of 300 yards. A property owner may operate an off-road vehicle on his own property without registering the vehicle, but the vehicle cannot be operated off the owner's property. In addition, an off-road motorcycle-type vehi-

cle used exclusively for scheduled racing events is not required to be registered. The bill also prohibits the operation of off-road motorcycle-type vehicles in a reckless manner, at unreasonable rates of speed, at night without a headlamp in operation, within 200 feet of a residence or institution, or by an intoxicated person.

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
