17 AN ACT to Eliminate the Requirement that
18 Supreme Judicial Court Briefs be Bound.

20 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
21 follows:

22 4 MRSA §55, as amended by PL 1979, c. 13, §§3-A
23 and 3-B, is further amended to read:

24 §55. Preservation of briefs

25 The clerk of the Supreme Judicial Court shall
26 preserve 2 complete sets of briefs filed in all cases
27 in the Supreme Judicial Court sitting as the ~~law~~
28 ~~court~~ Law Court. Under the direction of the Chief
29 Justice, these briefs shall be arranged in order ~~and~~
30 ~~bound as designated by the Chief Justice~~. One set
31 each shall thereupon be delivered to the law libraries
32 respectively of Cumberland and Penobscot Counties
33 for preservation and reference. All expenses incur-

1 red in preparation and delivery of these briefs shall
2 be paid by the State from the appropriation for
3 expenses of the Supreme Judicial Court.

4 STATEMENT OF FACT

5 This bill deletes the requirement that Supreme
6 Judicial Court briefs be bound, thus providing for
7 the use of other reproduction techniques in addition
8 to printing and binding.
