STATE OF MAINE
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE
AN ACT Substituting the Board of Over- seers of the Bar as the Keeper of the Records of Members of the Bar in Place of Administrative Assistant to the Chief Justice.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
4 MRSA §807 first ¶, as amended by PL 1979, c. 700, §2, is further amended to read:
Unless duly admitted to the bar of this State, no person shall may practice law or any branch thereof, or hold himself out to practice law or any branch thereof, within the State or before any court therein, or demand or receive any remuneration for such those services rendered in this State. Whoever, not being duly admitted to the bar of this State,

1 shall practice law or any branch thereof, or hold 2 himself out to practice law or any branch thereof, 3 within the State or before any court therein, or 4 demand or receive any remuneration for such those 5 services rendered in this State, shall be guilty of a 6 Class E crime. This section shall not be construed apply to practice before any Federal Court by any 7 8 person duly admitted to practice therein; nor to a 9 person pleading or managing his own cause in court; 10 nor to the officer or employee of a corporation, 11 partnership or governmental entity, who is not an attorney, but is appearing for that organization in 12 13 an action cognizable as a small claim under Title 14, 14 chapter 738. In all proceedings, the fact, as shown 15 by the records of the Administrative Assistant to the 16 Chief Justice Board of Overseers of the Bar, that such that person is not recorded as a member of the 17 18 bar shall be prima facie evidence that he is not a 19 member of the bar licensed to practice law in the 20 State.

21 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill substitutes the Board of Overseers of the Bar as the keeper of the records of members of the bar for the Administrative Assistant to the Chief Justice, a position which no longer exists.
