| 20 | otherwise distributing cigarettes or other tobacco |
| 21 22 | products for profit, or an employee or agent of such a person, may, in the course of his business, dis- |
| 23 | tribute any cigarette or other tobacco product free |
| 24 | to any children under the age of 18 years in any |

SENATE AMENDMENT " A" to H.P. 395, L.D. 478

1 16 years constitutes endangering the welfare of a 2 child and is a Class D crime. In order to convict a 3 person for violation of this law, the State must 4 prove beyond a reasonable doubt that the crime has 5 been committed. This amendment:

- 6 1. Increases the age prohibiting the sale or 7 distribution of cigarettes or tobacco to a child 8 from under 16 years of age to under 18 years of 9 age; and
- Facilitates the prosecution of violators by
 requiring the State to prove the commission of
 the crime by a "preponderance of the evidence,"
 a far lesser burden than now required by law.
