6	COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to H.P. 406,
7	L.D. 489, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to the Minimum Wage
8	for Waiters and Waitresses."
9	Amend the bill by inserting at the beginning of
10	the first line after the enacting clause the abbrevi-
11	ation and figure 'Sec. 1.'
12	Further amend the bill by striking out the first
13	3 lines after the amending clause (page 1, lines 24
14	to 26 in L.D.) and inserting in their place the fol-
15	lowing 'In determining the wage of a service
16	employee, the amount paid'
17	Further amend the bill by striking out in the 7th
18	line after the amending clause (page 1, line 30 in
19	L.D.) the figure and symbol "50%" and inserting in
20	its place the following '50% 45%'
21	Further amend the bill in the 7th line after the
22	amending clause (page 1, line 30 in L.D.) by insert-
23	ing after the word "rate" the following 'and, after
24	January 1, 1985, not by an amount in excess of 40% of
25	the applicable minimum wage rate'
26 27	Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:
28 29	'Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 1984.'
30	STATEMENT OF FACT
31	The purpose of this amendment is to gradually
32	decrease the allowable tip credit in order to bring
33	the minimum wage for service employees in line with
34	the federal minimum for service employees of larger

employers. Federal law lowered the maximum tip
credit allowed employers in lieu of wages from 50% to
40% in 5% increments occurring on January 1, 1979,
and January 2, 1980.

5 This amendment decreases the maximum tip credit 6 from 50% to 45% on January 1, 1984, and further 7 decreases the maximum tip credit to 40% on January 1, 8 1985.
