Sec. 8. Managed by board of trustees; bond; organization; tenure of office; compensation; report. All the affairs of said the water district shall be managed by a board of trustees composed of 3 members, chosen by the municipal officers of Mexico. entering upon the duties of their office the said trustees shall file a bond for the faithful performance of their trust, with the treasurer of said the Town of Mexico, in such sum as may be required, from time to time, by the selectmen of said Mexico, for said the bond to be paid by the Mexico Water District. As soon as convenient after the members of said the board have been chosen and qualisaid the trustees shall hold a meeting and organize by the election of a president chairman 7 and elerk, adopt a corporate seal and when necessary may choose a treasurer and all other needful officers and agents for the proper conduct and management of the affairs of said district. The trustees shall annually choose a superintendent who shall be the administrator, treasurer and clerk of the district, and who shall manage the day-to-day affairs of the district. The trustees shall contract with the Town to provide operational services to the dis-Mexico The contract shall designate the appropriate trict. municipal official to be superintendent who shall serve for the term of the contract. At said the first meeting, they shall determine by lot the term of office of each trustee so that one shall serve for one year, one for 2 years and one for 3 years, whenever the term of office of a trustee expires the body which appointed said the trustee shall appoint a successor to serve the full term of 3 years, and in case any other vacancy arises it shall be filled in like manner for the unexpired term. They may adopt such bylaws as are necessary for their own convenience and the proper management of the affairs of the district. The term of office of said the chosen shall be considered to date trustees first from the first Monday of April, in the year o£ bord mineteen hundred and twenty-mine 1929. Said The may procure an office and incur such trustees expenses as may be necessary. Each member shall receive in full compensation for his services an allowance of \$200 \$300 per year, plus \$15 for each meeting attended up to a total of 20 meetings per year. At the close of each fiscal year the trustees

- 17 Rates regulated. All individuals, Sec. 14. 18 firms and corporations, whether private, public or municipal, shall pay to the treasurer of said the 19 20 district the rates established by said the board 21 trustees for the water used by them, and said the 22 rates shall be uniform within the territory supplied 23 by the district. Said The rates shall be so established as to provide revenue for the following pur-24 25 poses:
- I. To pay the current expenses for operating and maintaining the water system;
- II. To provide for the payment of interest on the indebtedness created by the district; and

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III. To provide each year a sum equal to not less than one-half of one per cent 1% nor more than five per cent 10% of the entire indebtedness created by the district, which sum shall be turned into a sinking fund and there kept to provide for the extinguishment of said the indebtedness. The money aside for the sinking fund shall be devoted to the retirement of the obligations of the district or invested in such securities as savings banks are allowed to hold.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to modernize the administration of the Mexico Water District and coordinate its activities with municipal activities of a similar nature. The repeal of Private and Special Law 1929, chapter 102, sections 9, 10 and 11 is occasioned by obsolescence and the recent enactment of statewide legislation covering these areas.

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
